### Brief Summary of the 2003 Reunion

The reunion got under way on Friday afternoon with registration activity, displays, and cousins getting together. Rod Violette was available to extract genealogy charts from his computer for those who requested them. On Friday evening we continued our get together and were also entertained by Melanie Saucier, a young girl from Fort Kent, Me., who sang a number of songs in both French and English. Her focus was on songs from our Acadian heritage and her mother, Diane, and her father, Gary, accompanied her.

Saturday morning saw many people going on two bus tours visiting on both sides of the border with stops at the St. Basile cemetery. There are crosses commemorating the original Acadian settlers of that region and Francois Violette was one of those people. St. Basile is the original parish that served the Acadian settlers. Another stop was in St. Leonard, N.B. to show the land along the Grand River where Francois homesteaded when he first arrived in the upper St. John Valley around 1790. There is a big Irving Lumber operation on that property today. In Van Buren the tour stopped at the Violette monument, along the banks of Violette Stream, which was commemorated at our 1981 Violette Reunion held in Van Buren. The final stop was at the Acadian Village in Keegan where there is a collection of old homes and historic artifacts. The tours were treated to a nice lunch of home made stew and "ploys" before leaving for Madawaska.. Thank you to Camille Violette and Alderic Violette for their help on the tour buses.

Another tour taking place on Saturday morning was to Fraser Paper Mills in Madawaska. Michael Violette, who is a Fraser employee, conducted that tour showing how paper is made.

On Saturday afternoon we had our business meeting when we conducted the business of the association and elected our officers for the coming term.
