GENEALOGY CHART REQUESTS

Time marches on, and so does our quest for our family ancestors and their descendants down to the current generations. Since the Reunion in August of 2011, I have added over 8,000 names to our family tree. I now have about 75,000 names; close to 20,000 are direct descendants of our progenitor, François Violet. The additional names are from the spouses and their ancestors that married into the Violette clan.

For the 2011 Reunion I had prepared genealogy charts for about 100 members that had requested them prior to the Reunion during the preregistration process. During the Reunion I spent most of my time trying to satisfy the requests made at the Reunion, but I need to change that procedure this time. I will prepare similar charts prior to the upcoming Reunion in 2014 from pre-orders during the advance registration process and have them available at the Reunion.

For those registering at the Reunion, I will have you fill out a form giving me the information I need, and mail the charts to you later. You can download the form in Microsoft Word document format from our web site's Genealogy page.

I suggest a fee of \$10 for the pre-ordered charts and an additional \$5 for those ordering at the Reunion to cover mailing expense. Any amounts over the actual cost will be donated to the Association.

CMA 2014 ACTIVITIES

Opening Ceremonies

August 8th 2014, Edmundston (NB)

Opening Day will be structured according to the concept of routes converging from points of entry to the territory toward "Parc Turgeon" in Edmundston where the opening ceremonies will take place.

Acadian National Day

August 15th 2014, St. David (Maine)

To facilitate the logistics of customs formalities at the border, the August 15th activities are planned following a schedule and a geographical organization that will encourage participants to cross the border from all entry points at the beginning of the day. The participants will be encouraged to leave their cars on Canadian soil and use a shuttle service to cross the border. A second shuttle service will provide transportation towards St. David\Madawaska where the afternoon and evening festivities will take place.

New Beginning Ceremonies

August 24th 2014, Témiscouata-sur-le-Lac (Québec)

To encourage and illustrate the collaborative gains developed in Acadia of Lands and Forests because of the CMA 2014, we are exploring a pairing idea between municipalities with groups of three, one triad in Témiscouata, one in New Brunswick and one in Maine. Each triad would collaborate to offer an event on August 24th which would represent the result of their collective commitment.

PASSPORTS

With Reunion 2014 being located in Van Buren ME you will likely want to visit on both sides on the U.S.-Canadian border. You will need a passport or passport card to re-enter the U.S. as a U.S. citizen or a passport to re-enter Canada as a Canadian citizen. This applies to all ages, including children.

US Passport Requirements

The US now issues passport cards in addition to the traditional passport books. The cards are less expensive and can be used to enter the US from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, and Bermuda at land border crossings or sea ports-of-entry. Cards cannot be used for international air travel. Both adults and children under 16 require passport books or passport cards.
