History of The Violette Family Association

July 16, 1978 Rita Violette Lippe after doing years of research on the Violette Family decided to hold a family reunion. She planned the reunion to be held in the parish hall of the Catholic church in Methuen, MA., and originally planned for about 50 to attend. Well, 375 showed up and the Violette Family Association (VFA) was formed that very day.

August 1978 The first VFA newsletter was published and mailed to 46 families

August 1979 The second Violette reunion was held in Augusta, ME. 489 attended the banquet. Maurice Violette was the reunion chairman.

August 1981 Third reunion held in Van Buren, ME, the cradle of the Violette family. There were approximately 850 in attendance including two families of Violettes from France. The highlight of the reunion was the dedication of the large stone memorial to "Francois Violet". It is located in the "Violette Brook Park" on Main Street, Van Buren, ME. Cost was \$1177. Membership stands at 1053. Elmer Violette was the reunion chairman.

September 1982 Forty seven Violettes undertook a sentimental voyage of dis covery back to the Old Country of France. They were accompanied by the two people most responsible for discovering the origins of the Violette family: Rita Violette Lippe and Maurice Violette.

1984 Rita Violette Lippe published her long awaited book on the history and genealogy of the Violette Family. Rita was awarded the title of "Genealogist Emeritus" by the Federation des Societes d'Histoire de Quebec.

August 1984 Fourth Violette reunion held at Windsor, CT. 600 were in attendance. Membership now at 1380.

August 1987 Fifth reunion held in Portland, ME. Maurice Violette was the reunion chairman.

January 1990 Violette family mailing list now computerized thanks to MBR# 621, David Violette of Lewiston, ME. It is a tremendous help in keeping the membership lists and preparing mailing labels.

1990 Maurice Violette of Augusta, ME., published a booklet entitled "The Violette Family History".

August 1990 Sixth Violette family reunion held in Grand Falls, N.B. Roger Violette was the reunion chairman.

August 1993 Seventh reunion held in Lewiston, ME. David Violette was the reunion chairman.

July 1996Eighth reunion held in Gorham/Shelburne, N.H.John Violette was the reunion chairman.

July 1999 Ninth reunion held in Westford, MA. Judy Trudo was the reunion chairperson.

June 18, 2000 We mourned the loss of Elmer Violette, one of our more illustrious and accomplished members. Elmer was the chairman of the Van Buren reunion. He held many elected and appointed positions including Van Buren Municipal Court judge, Maine State Representative, Maine State Senator, Maine Superior Court Judge, and Maine Supreme Court Justice.

August 2002 Tenth reunion held in Edmundston, N.B. with 250 in attendance. Harold Violette was the reunion chairman.

To date there have been 54 newsletters published in 26 years and we now mail to approximately 1000 families.

IMPORTANT LETTER RE: OUR HERITAGE

Dear John,

Many Violette Family Assn. Members, during our last reunion in Edmundston, N.B., visited the site of the memorial to Francois Violette at Violette Brook in Van Buren. Francois had built the first gristmill (moulin a farine) on this site about 1791 to grind buckwheat flour. Although the original mill was eventually sold and modernized, a gristmill was maintained there until just a few years ago when it was purchased by a Mr. Corriveau in Frenchville and operated there for a number of years. It is now for sale along with a wool carding mill that came from somewhere in the St. John River Valley.

The Acadian Village would be a proper place to install these mills to preserve the Francois Violette heritage in the Violette Brook Settlement area. If they are not acquired now, they will be lost forever.

The Acadian Village (where you had that great Acadian lunch of chicken stew, cretons and plogues) has 16 buildings, many are original buildings that have been moved to the site. All of the structures house a large quantity and variety of artifacts from the early homes of the area.

Alice & I have talked to Ann Roy, President of Notre Heritage Vivant / Our Living Heritage, and we will provide the funds to acquire these mills now and set them up at the Acadian Village.

As you and I have discussed, the Acadian Village could use the support of the Violette Family Association members to acquire and preserve items of the early settlement and also to maintain and keep the buildings in repair. Notre Heritage Vivant is a 501 (C) 3 organization under IRS laws and donations are deductible to the extent allowed by law.
