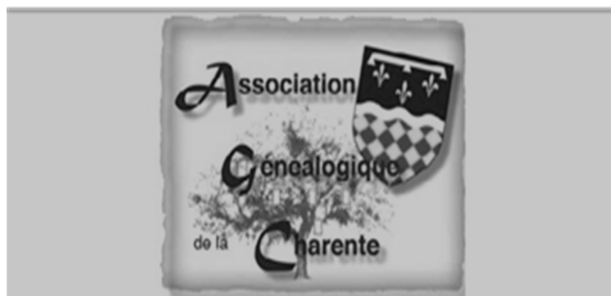

## FINDING PROOF

For many years, the Violette Family Association stopped at Louis Viollet as the most distant relative in our direct family line. Many had theorized that his parents were Jacques Viollet and Marie Leonard, but no one had the proof to confirm this connection. Louis's parish marriage record failed to record who his parents were.

While researching our ancestral home in Villejésus, France, our Historian became aware that Louis Viollet and his wife Marie Doux had sought out a notary in the village of Marcillac-Lanville, which is less than 7 km south of Villejésus. On 3 January 1715, four days before their marriage in Villejésus, a Contrat de Mariage (marriage contract) was completed and the contract spelled out that his parents were Jacques Viollet and Marie Leonard.

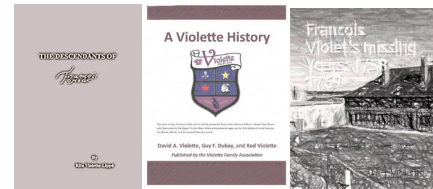
The family association now has the required proof (primary source) and our records have been updated accordingly. More details of this discovery will be contained in the future research report on Our Ancestral Homeland that our historian is working on.

## VIOLETTE FAMILY HISTORY BOOKS



We have three (3) Violette family history books available from the Violette Family Association.

The first book is the “Descendants of Francois Violet” by Rita Violette Lippe which was digitized since the original books are no longer available.

Our second book is a narrative of the founders of the Violette family detailed in “A Violette History.”

The authors are David A. Violette (VFA #621), Guy Dubay (VFA #689) & Rod Violette (VFA #12).

The third book is by our VFA historian Peter Violette (VFA #1793) titled “Francois Violet’s Missing Years: 1758-1769”.

Peter did a deep dive into the years that the association had no records for our founder, Francois.

The purpose was to gain an insight and better understanding of what was happening during those missing years and how they may have impacted our pioneer ancestor to New France, present day Canada.

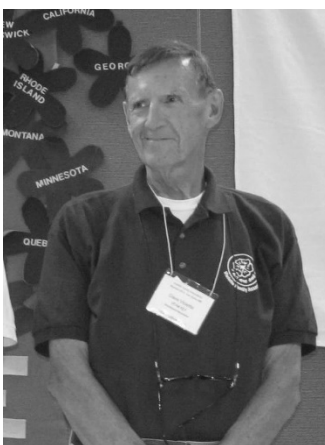

## A FAREWELL TRIBUTE TO David A. Violette

This is our first newsletter since our president David Violette (VFA #621) passed away in December 2021 and we wanted to mention some of the many accomplishments he made for the association over his 40+ years of service. Joining the VFA back in 1980, David worked tirelessly to grow, improve and streamline the association. It was back in 1989 when David's vast talent with computers was recognized within the association. With help from his wife Elaine, David took on the challenge of computerizing the association's membership list to include addresses, greatly aiding the delivery of all subsequent newsletter mail-outs.

In 1990, while serving as secretary with his father Dick (VFA #100) as president of the association, he introduced a new, improved, and multi-columned newsletter. In 2005, both David and his father were instrumental in making the dedication of the Corriveau Grist Mill happen at the Acadian Village in Van Buren, Maine at the Violette Industrial Building. Next, David started the VFA Facebook group to help keep members and others interested in the association, family happenings and other interesting Violette-related items.



Over the years, David served as secretary, treasurer, de-facto webmaster and president, this last position for over 10 years. In addition, he co-authored a book with

Guy Dubay (VFA #892) and Rod Violette (VFA #12), appropriately titled 'A Violette History', released in 2014. His next monumental milestone was incorporating onto the website the genealogy database that genealogist Rod Violette had created and worked on for many, many years. This accomplishment made available to VFA members over 81,000 individuals and over 32,000 marriages in a searchable format. It was during this introduction that David transitioned the website from VioletteFamily.org to the current VioletteRegistry.com. Finally, in 2020,

David obtained the needed permissions to publish and release Rita Violette Lippe's (VFA #1) 1984 book 'The Descendants of Francois Violet' which had been out of print since 2008. David went so far as to tear apart his own copy of Rita's book to scan and digitize it for the purpose of making it available for future generations of Violettes. It is fair to say that David did so very much for our family association and he will be greatly missed!
